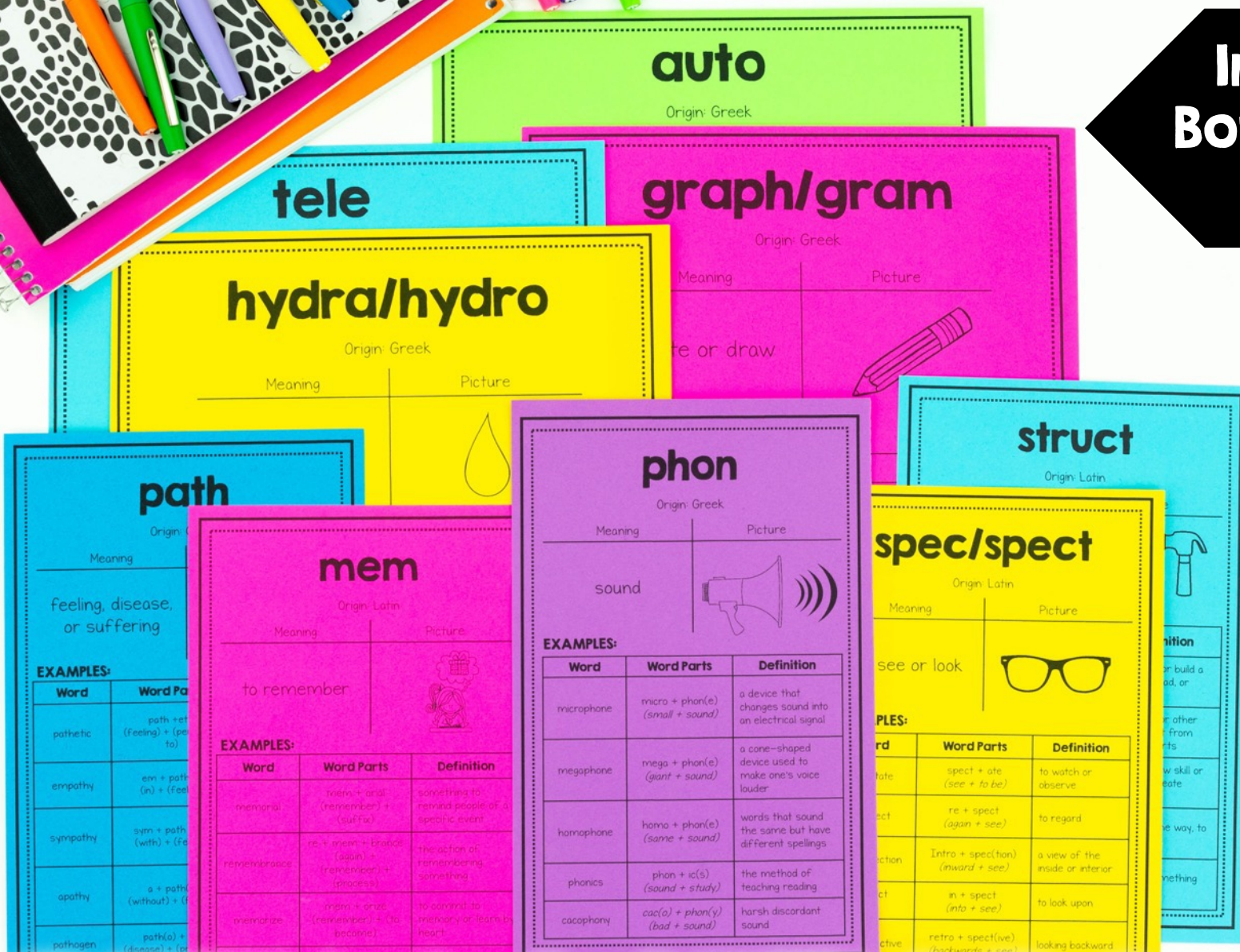

Meaning	Picture
far or distant	

EXAMPLES:

Word	Word Parts	Definition
telephone	tele + phon(e) (far + sound)	a device used to transmit sound over a long distance
teleport	tele + port (far + carry)	to be transported a long distance instantly
television	tele + vis(ion) (far + see)	a device used to transmit images
telegram	tele + gram (far + write)	to send a message in writing
telepathy	tele + path(y) (far + feeling)	to communicate thoughts or feelings directly to another person's mind

auto

Origin: Greek


Meaning	Picture
self	

EXAMPLES:

Word	Word Parts	Definition
autograph	auto + graph (self + write)	a signature, especially that of a celebrity
automobile	auto + mob(ile) (self + move)	a car
automatic	auto + matic (self + willing)	a device or process working by itself
autopilot	auto + pilot (self + guide)	an electronic control self-guiding system
autonomous	auto + nomous (self + law)	having the freedom to act independently
autoimmune	auto + immune (self + resistance)	an internal attack on one's own body

bio

Meaning	Picture
life	

EXAMPLES:

Word	Word Parts	Definition
biology	bio + ology (life + study)	the science of life or living matter
biography	bio + graph(y) (life + write)	a written account of another person's life
biochemistry	bio + chem(istry) (life + chemical)	the science dealing with the chemistry of living matter
biopsy	bio + opsy (life + view of)	to remove and view tissue from a living body for testing purposes
autobiography	auto + bio + graph(y) (self + life + write)	a history of a person's life written by that person

graph/gram

write or draw	

EXAMPLES:

Word	Word Parts	Definition
autograph	auto + graph (self + write)	a signature
photograph	photo + graph (light + write)	a picture
paragraph	para + graph (beside + write)	a section of writing
biography	bio + graph(y) (life + write)	a written account of someone's life
telegraph	tele + graph (far + write)	to send a message from a far distance
geography	geo + graph(y) (earth + write)	the study of the earth's features
polygraph	poly + graph (many + write)	a device that can record many variations

hydra/hydro

Origin: Greek


Meaning	Picture
water	

EXAMPLES:

Word	Word Parts	Definition
hydrate	hydra + ate (water + to be)	to combine with water
hydration	hydra + tion (water + action)	the process of combining with water
hydrant	hydra + ant (water + agent)	a water faucet
hydrophobia	hydra + phobia (water + fear)	fear of water
hydroplane	hydra + plane (water + vehicle)	a light, fast motor boat to skim over the surface of water
dehydrate	de + hydra + ate (reverse + water + to be)	to remove water or moisture from something

chron

Origin: Greek


Meaning	Picture
time	

EXAMPLES:

Word	Word Parts	Definition
chronically	chron + ic + ally (time) + (pertaining to)	in a persistent or long-lasting way
chronometer	chron(o) + meter (time) + (measure)	a tool used to measure time when there are variations
chronicle	chron + icle (time) + (formed)	a written account of an important historical event
chronology	chron + ology (time) + (study)	the arrangement of dates in the order they took place
chronic	chron + ic (time) + (pertaining to)	persisting for a long time or constantly

scrib/script

Origin: Latin


Meaning	Picture
write	

EXAMPLES:

Word	Word Parts	Definition
inscribe	in + scribe (into) + (write)	to write or carve on something
description	de + script + ion (down) + (write)	a written account of a person, object or account that includes adjectives
transcript	trans + script (across) + (write)	a written version of material that was presented in a different format
scribble	scrib + ble (write)	To write or draw carelessly
prescription	pre + script + ion (before) + (write)	Medical instructions written by a doctor

ject

Origin: Latin

Meaning	Picture
to throw or hurl	

EXAMPLES:


Word	Word Parts	Definition
inject	in + ject (into + throw)	to force or drive (a fluid) into something
reject	re + ject (again + throw)	to refuse to accept
dejected	de + ject(ed) (down + throw)	being down, sad or depressed
object	ob + ject (against + throw)	to disagree or oppose
project	pro + ject (forward + throw)	to throw or cast forward
trajectory	tra + ject + ory (across + throw + place)	a path on which something travels or moves

stamp, impression, form	

EXAMPLES:

Word	Word Parts	Definition
typical	typ + ical (form) + (condition of)	having standards or normal traits or qualities
typing	typ + ing (impression) + (action)	the action of skill of writing something
prototype	proto + type (original) + (form)	the first model or example of something
typography	typ + ography (form) + (write)	the style of printed content
typology	typ + ology (form) + (study)	the study of symbols and types

liter

Origin: Latin


Meaning	Picture
letters	

EXAMPLES:

Word	Word Parts	Definition
literature	liter + ature (letters) + (process)	writings in prose or verse (stories)
alliteration	al + liter + ation (join) + (letters) + (process)	the repetition of the same initial letters in a group of words
illiterate	Il + liter + ate (not) + (letters) + (person)	someone who does not have the ability to read or write
literal	liter + al (letters) + (pertaining to)	taking words at their most basic meaning
literacy	liter + acy (letters) + (state of)	the ability to read and write

cent

Origin: Latin


Meaning	Picture
hundred	

EXAMPLES:

Word	Word Parts	Definition
century	cent + ury (hundred) +	a period of one hundred years
centipede	cent(i) + ped(e) (hundred) + (foot)	an insect with many legs
cent	cent (hundred)	a unit of money, a penny
centurion	cent + (ur)ion (hundred) + (condition of)	the commander of a century in the ancient Roman army
centennial	cent + ennial (hundred) + (recurring)	a 100th anniversary celebration

frac/frag

Origin: Latin


Meaning	Picture
break	

EXAMPLES:

Word	Word Parts	Definition
fractured	frac + ture (break) + (process)	to break or cause a break
fragment	frag + ment (break) + (result)	a small part broken off something larger
fraction	frac + tion (break) + (condition of)	a small unit of a larger whole
fragile	frag + ile (break) + (adjective)	easily broken or destroyed
refract	re + fract (again) + (break)	to cause a ray of light to change direction

circum

Origin: Latin


Meaning	Picture
around	

EXAMPLES:

Word	Word Parts	Definition
circumference	circum + ference (around) + (carry)	the distance around a circle or sphere
circumstances	circum + stances (around) + (stand)	a fact or condition related to an event
circumnavigate	circum + navigate (around) + (travel)	to travel or sail around something
circumvent	circum + vent (around) + (come)	to find a way around an obstacle
circumspect	circum + spect (around) + (see)	thinking cautiously about something before you say or do it

cred

Origin: Latin


Meaning	Picture
believe, trust	

EXAMPLES:

Word	Word Parts	Definition
credible	cred + ible (believe) + (able)	convincing, honest, being believable
credentials	cred + entials (believe) + (characterized by)	qualities or experience that suggests someone is capable
credit	cred + it (believe)	acknowledge someone's involvement in the creation of something
incredible	in + cred + ible (not) + (believe) + (able)	something that is hard to believe
accredited	ac + cred + ited (to) + (trust)	a person or institution that has been authorized

aster/astro

Origin: Greek


Meaning	Picture
stars or outer space	

EXAMPLES:

Word	Word Parts	Definition
astronomy	astro + nomy (stars + system of rules)	science that deals beyond the earth's atmosphere
asteroid	aster + oid (star + similar to)	a small rocky body orbiting in outer space
astronomical	astro + nomical (star + knowledge)	relating to astronomy
astronaut	astro + naut (star + sailor)	a person engaged in or trained for space flight
asterisk	aster + isk (star + pertaining to)	a symbol (*) used in text as an indication of additional notes
astronomer	astro + nom + er (star + identify + someone who)	an expert in astronomy

form

Origin: Latin

Meaning	Picture
shape	

EXAMPLES:

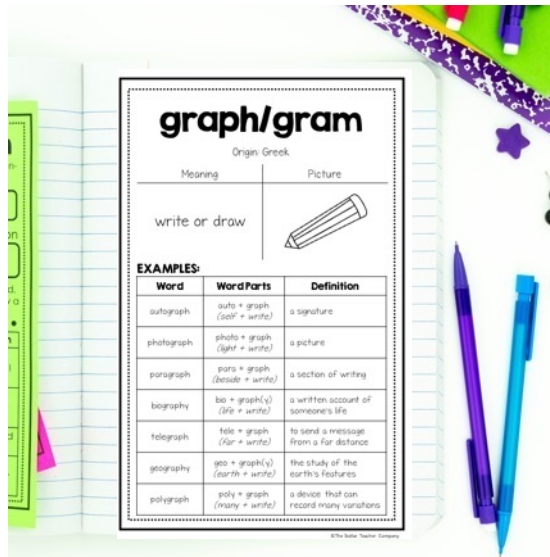
Word	Word Parts	Definition
formation	form + ation (shape) + (process)	the process of being shaped or formed
transform	trans + form (across) + (shape)	to make a dramatic change in the form or appearance
deformed	de + form(ed) (reverse) + (shape)	an abnormal shape, misshapen
conform	con + form (together) + (shape)	to comply with rules or standards
formula	form(ula) (shape)	a method or process for achieving specific results

Each chart can be printed as a half page. They are the perfect fit for student journals.



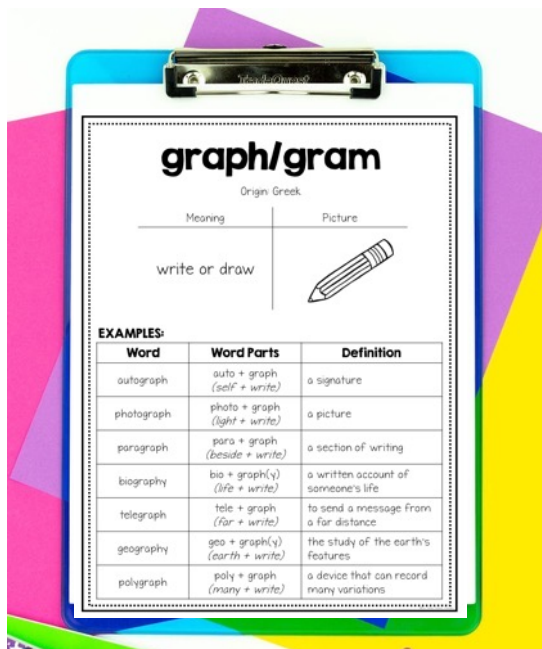
DIGITAL VERSION

A digital option created using Google Slides is included to make it easy to tech virtually.



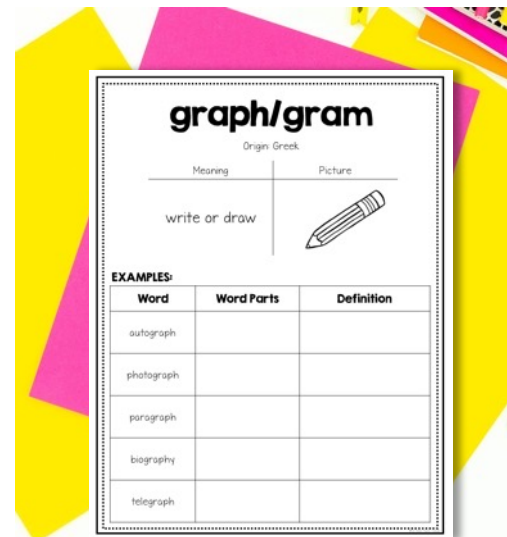
FULL PAGE OPTIONS

EXAMPLES:

Word	Word Parts	Definition
construct	con + struct (together) + (build)	to create or build a building, road, or machine
structures	struct + ures (build)	a building or other object built from several parts
instruct	in + struct (towards) + (build)	teach a new skill or subject, create knowledge
obstruct	ob + struct (against) + (build)	to get in the way, to block
reconstruct	re + con + struct (again) + (build)	to build something again

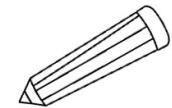
