


Each word wall card can be printed in two different styles.



Option 1:

Each word wall card includes a title, a definition, example, and an image to help students remember an example of that specific type of figurative language.

Sound words that make the actual sound when you read them.




hyperbole

These word wall cards have the exact same information, they are just formatted in a way that they can be cut apart into sorting cards.








Each word wall card can be printed in black and white or in color.







