


# A reading response assignment your students will love...





# **Printing Directions Included**


If you have never printed on sticky notes, there are printing directions included. It is super simple and once you start, you won't be able to stop.



Step 1: Print the sticky note template.



Step 2: Place sticky notes on top of the template.



Step 3: Place the sticky notes back in the printer and reprint the template.




# Not interested in the sticky notes? No problem.

- Use as an exit ticket or quick assessment.






# **Includes Digital Versions**

I love to provide both print and digital options in my resources. This resource includes a digital version created using Google Slides.


While it's hard to "print" and share sticky notes in a digital version, this resource comes with a digital note taking option created using Google Slides.

Students can still read and respond using the same prompts in this resource, but in a digital format.




