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

WORD OF THE WEEK OVERVIEW

Each week your students will go through the same set of tasks to help them become more confident in their ability to use context clues to discover the meaning of the word of the week.



- Monday Students read a short paragraph with the word of the week in it. Students use the context clues to predict what the word of the week means..
- Tuesday Students look up the actual definition of the word of the week in a dictionary.
- Wednesday Students dig a little bit deeper and look up synonyms, antonyms, and figure out the part of speech for the word of the week
- Thursday Students draw a picture that represents the word of the week.
- Friday Students use the word of the week in a sentence to confirm their understanding of the word.
